To strengthen links with Europe, the Channel Islands are now establishing a representative office in Brussels.

The Islands are significant international finance centres and, along with our trading partners in the City of London and elsewhere, are likely to be affected by EU reform of financial markets regulation. They also form part of the EU customs territory and can be considered within the EU for free trade in agricultural products. Also, our airspace and territorial sea are surrounded by EU regulated airspace and EU waters. In short, the work of the EU really matters to the Channel Islands.

The Channel Islands are comprised of the Bailiwick of Guernsey and the Bailiwick of Jersey. Although separate jurisdictions, the Islands are establishing a joint office in Brussels in order to advance their joint interests and represent the Channel Islands at the heart of the European Union.

These two newly created roles provide a unique opportunity to shape and drive forward European engagement for the Channel Islands, working closely with government, regulators and business to ensure that EU Institutions and key European governments can gain a better understanding of the Islands.
